Artworks Mentioning Abortion Are Censored: Take Action

Six art works by nationally recognized artists Michelle Hartney, Lydia Nobles and Katrina Majkut were removed from an exhibit at Lewis-Clark State College in Idaho because they mentioned or alluded to abortion.



The college claimed that the art violated a state criminal law against "promoting abortion," but it apparently forgot about the **First Amendment** to the U.S.Constitution protecting freedom of speech and expression.

Take action. Write to the president of Lewis-Clark State College.

Ask that the college: (1) **immediately reinstate** the censored artworks and apologize to the artists involved (2) take a public **stand against censorship** of discussions about abortion; (3) make and reaffirm its **commitment to the First Amendment and the Freedom of Speech and Expression** (4) work to **reject and repeal** legislation that they claim interferes with First Amendment rights (5) affirm that the college **supports the discussion of reproductive health and human rights**.
